Clinton to Meet with Members of Law Enforcement Leaders to Reduce Crime and Incarceration

Meeting Comes After Top Cops Write to Candidates with Policy Prescriptions

Today Democratic Presidential Candidate Hilary Clinton will meet with top police officials representing [Law Enforcement Leaders to Reduce Crime and Incarceration](#), a group of nearly 200 current and former police chiefs, sheriffs, federal and state prosecutors, and attorneys general from all 50 states advocating for policies that reduce both crime and unnecessary incarceration.
