Former Dallas Chief David Brown Joins Law Enforcement Leaders as Co-Chair

Law Enforcement Leaders to Reduce Crime and Incarceration is pleased to announce **David Brown**, the recently-retired Dallas Police Chief, as its new co-chair.

Brown joins co-chair **Ronal Serpas**, former Superintendent of the New Orleans Police Department, as the head of [the group](#), which unites nearly 200 current and former police chiefs, sheriffs, federal and state prosecutors, and attorneys general from all 50 states to urge for a reduction in both crime and incarceration.



Brown has been a member of Law Enforcement Leaders since the group launched in October 2015 and was a 33-year veteran of the Dallas police department until his retirement in September. He rose through the ranks from a patrol officer to become the chief of police in 2010, and led the department and the city through July's tragic shootings.

“We’re thrilled to have David join our leadership,” said **Serpas**. “He commands deep respect in our community after dedicating three decades to protecting the citizens of Dallas, where he developed a national reputation as a strong leader who prioritized strengthening police-community relations. His insight will be a great asset to our work advocating for commonsense policies that will help law enforcement reduce both crime and incarceration and, ultimately, make our communities safer.”
