## Law Enforcement: House Prison Reform Bill Is Insufficient

As House Passes Prison Reform Bill, Law Enforcement Leaders Urges Senate Action on Sentencing Reform

Washington D.C. – Following the passage of a prison reform bill in the House of Representatives today, <u>Law Enforcement Leaders</u> issued the following statement:

"The narrow prison reform bill passed by the House today will not effectively address the problems in our criminal justice system unless it is paired with swift action on sentencing reform," said Ronal Serpas, Executive Director of Law Enforcement Leaders and former Police Chief in New Orleans. "If we want to successfully reduce the cycle of crime and curb recidivism, we need sentencing reform alongside prison reform measures, like the bi-partisan Sentencing Reform and Corrections Act advancing through the Senate."

Over 60 members of Law Enforcement Leaders recently sent a <u>letter</u> to Senate and House leadership expressing their concerns with legislation focuses on prison reform alone, and urging action on legislation that includes both sentencing and prison reform.
